Study Smarter Not Harder This Winter

The shorter days and colder weather signify that winter is on its way. Other markers that we are ending the year are our first quarter grades, and holiday breaks that interrupt, but also give us a chance to reflect on our performance so far this school year. Whether your grades are great or getting there, it is always a good time to improve your habits when studying and learning information! Below are some fun suggestions to improve your studying techniques, help retain the information you learn, and process the information into deeper levels of understanding, not simply memorization!

- 1: **Studying alone is great for focus, but studying with friends can be fun!** Come up with fun ways to incorporate your curriculum into your activities, whether its high stakes spelling bees, turning reading exercises into comedy shows, or just having someone around to keep the vibe light while work is being done.
- 2: **Index cards are more than just a piece of paper.** Index cards are so versatile, and can always be used in a game of Jeopardy, matching pairs, or cue cards for a quiz show! If you have a lot of definitions and vocab, index cards break up the block of words staring back from the page!
- 3: **Treat Yourself!** Studying can be work, and sometimes we need more than the feeling of a job well done to motivate us to do it again. Reward yourself when you are done studying, get a fun snack, sing along to your favorite song, or take some time to just decompress. Rewarding yourself will make you more likely to do the work again!
- 4: **Learn, Relearn, Retain:** The best way to learn information is to go over it multiple times. Don't let the first time you learn something be the last time you visit it. Rereading, going over similar math problems, and refreshing your geography or dates are the best ways to retain information. The more you go back to information, the more it will stick with you. It is a great injection into games, as they get easier to answer over time, and it will show you how much progress you are actually making!
- 5: **Studying is about more than just the work.** It is about the way you live. Overstressed, overworked, overtired bodies are not the best fit for learning new info. Eating healthy, exercising, socializing, and getting appropriate rest will make you feel like your best self, and allow you to put your best self into everything you do, including studying. COLLEGE SPOTLIGHT: PAUL SMITH'S COLLEGE

Career Description:

Environmental scientists use their knowledge of the natural sciences to protect the environment and human health.

Duties:

- Determine data collection methods for research
- projects, investigations, and surveys
 Collect and compile environmental data from samples of air, soil, water, food, and other materials for scientific analysis
- Provide information and guidance to government officials, businesses, and the general public on possible environmental hazards and health risks
 Prepare technical reports and presentations that

Required Education:

For most entry-level jobs, environmental scientists must have a bachelor's degree, however, a master's degree may be needed for advancement. A broad approach to the natural sciences. Students typically take courses in biology, chemistry, geology, and physics. Many programs include an internship, which allows students to gain practical experience.

Earnings:

The median wage for environmentalists was \$73,230 in 2021. Most environmental scientists work full time

Future Outlook:

Employment of environmental scientists is projected to grow 8 percent from 2020 to 2029, much faster

TIME FOR SCHOLARSHIPS!



Congratulations to all of you who have their college applications submitted! For those of you who aren't quite there, time is ticking. Colleges seem to be getting decisions out quicker this year, but the sooner you get your application packages in, the more money you could be eligible for. Once the FAFSA is released at the end of December, it will be time to get this form completed. As we mentioned at our Financial Aid Night, we will be assisting all of you with this process.

One thing you can also be working on is looking for scholarships to apply for. This takes a little bit of effort on your part, but it could mean more free money for college! One thing is for certain, if you never apply, you will never get the award! The best place to start is a place very close to home, your School Counseling Office. Each of these offices and school webpages have a list of local scholarships available to students in your school. We have all of these links on our Senior page on the UB website. These local scholarships may have specific criteria for each scholarship, but there are many open to all graduating seniors.

Another place to look is your future college. Scholarships based on your grades (merit-based) are usually listed on the school's website, and may involve an additional application to be considered. Don't leave any money on the table when it comes to funding your education!

The last spots to consider when looking for scholarship money are community organizations and your employer, if you have a job. Larger chains definitely offer scholarships to their employees, but smaller ones may as well.

Two roads diverged in a yellow wood, And sorry I could not travel both And be one traveler, long I stood And looked down one as far as I could To where it bent in undergrowth;


Then took the other, as just as fair, And having perhaps the better claim, Because it was grassy and wanted wear; Though as for that the passing there Had worn them really about the same,

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A FIRST-GENERATION COLLEGE STUDENT?

Being a first-generation college student means that you come from a family where no parent has graduated from college. This in itself can put you at a distinct disadvantage when trying to navigate the college-going process. The good news is that we are here to help!

The federal TRIO programs (which include Upward Bound and Student Support Services) were created to help students overcome economic, social, academic, and cultural barriers to higher education. The law mandates that two-thirds of TRIO students must come from families with incomes no greater than I50% of federal poverty levels and in which neither parent graduated from college. The services they provide help TRIO students achieve college degrees at much higher rates than the national average.

IS COLLEGE NECESSARY FOR A SUCCESSFUL FUTURE?

New FAFSA- What to Expect

- When will the new FASFA be available? The expected launch is December 31, 2023
- Fewer Questions- The new FAFSA will contain significantly fewer questions.
- You can list more colleges- Students can list up to 20 colleges, up from 10 previously.
- **Pell Grant award expands-** More than 600,000 more students will be eligible for Pell Grants. The maximum award of \$7,395 is money that does not have to be paid back.
- All contributors need FSA IDs- The FSA ID (the Studentaid.gov username & password) will be required of all contributors (you, your biological or adoptive parents, or your parent's spouse). This can be done anytime by visiting studentaid.gov
- **Sibling discount removed-** Parents will no longer get a break for having multiple children in college at the same time.
- **IRS imports tax information-** All contributors must agree to allow the IRS to directly import their federal tax information to the FAFSA.
